Econ 3160 - Austrian Economics

W 10.50 AM - 1.30 PM :: LARRY EUBANKS

This course surveys the conceptual analysis of the Austrian School in economics. Topics include the Austrian School perspective on: market process, profit and loss, entrepreneurship, spontaneous order, money, inflation, recession, knowledge, competition, and economic progress.

Econ 3870 - Behavioral Economics

MW 12.15PM - 1.30 PM :: JOHN BROCK

This course explores the challenge to traditional models of economics offered by the work of economists and social scientists such as Daniel Kahneman. By exploring the role that social framing, personal psychology, and emotional responses play in economics decisions, the limits of traditional economic theory is explored and extensions to traditional theory considered

Econ 3150 - History of Econ Thought

MW 1.40PM - 2.55 PM :: DALE DEBOER

This course surveys the main schools of economic thought from the pre-cursors to the Classical economists through the modern neo-Classical reconciliation. The challenges posed by the Marxian critique and the Keynesian transformation will be considered.

Econ 3730 - Economics of South Asia

This course examines the evolution of South Asia (India and others) economies since their independence. Topics include their path of economic development, industrialization, agriculture and environment, globalization, gender issues, and inequality.

Econ 4020 - Advanced Macroeconomics

TTH 9.25AM - 10.40AM :: ED HOANG

Study of the core of macroeconomic theory using calculus. Topics include Keynesian vs. Classical economic models, macroeconomic growth models, open economy macroeconomics, and macroeconomic policy analysis.

Prerequisites: ECON 3020 with a "C" or better, and MATH 1120 or MATH 1350, or consent of instructor.

Econ 4500 - Money and Banking

MW 10.50 AM - 12.05 PM :: DALE DEBOER

The study of the interaction between financial markets and the Federal Reserve Banking system. Emphasizes the conduct of monetary policy to encourage economic growth and stability. Topics include interest rates, inflation, the money supply and the influence of these variables on the business cycle.
